July 31: Robert Wilson and the Byrd Hoffman Water Mill Foundation gave the Watermill Art Center's annual benefit. Guests entered the center's six-acre woods in Water Mill, N.Y., through a series of five red circle gates on a pine-needle path that led to a Chinese mountain landscape. There, they passed through the mountain's 20-foot tunnel, and emerged to see in the distance an illuminated fantasy Shanghai skyline constructed of bamboo over monolithic Indonesian stones dating from 350 B.C. that are owned by the center. The evening, attended by 650, included a dinner-dance and an art auction, raising more than \$850,000.
